1.1 **Objectives** => Clear, pertinent and measurable objectives, credibility of the scientific approach...

1.2 **Relation to the work programme** => addressing the challenge and the scope

SMART OBJECTIVES

S specific, concrete

- What **exactly** are you going to achieve?
- Is the objective written in a clear and **comprehensible** way?

M measurable

- How can you tell if the objective is reached?
- Are there clear **indicators** or **parameters** to measure the objective?
- How many, how large, how fast?

SMART OBJECTIVES

A acceptable

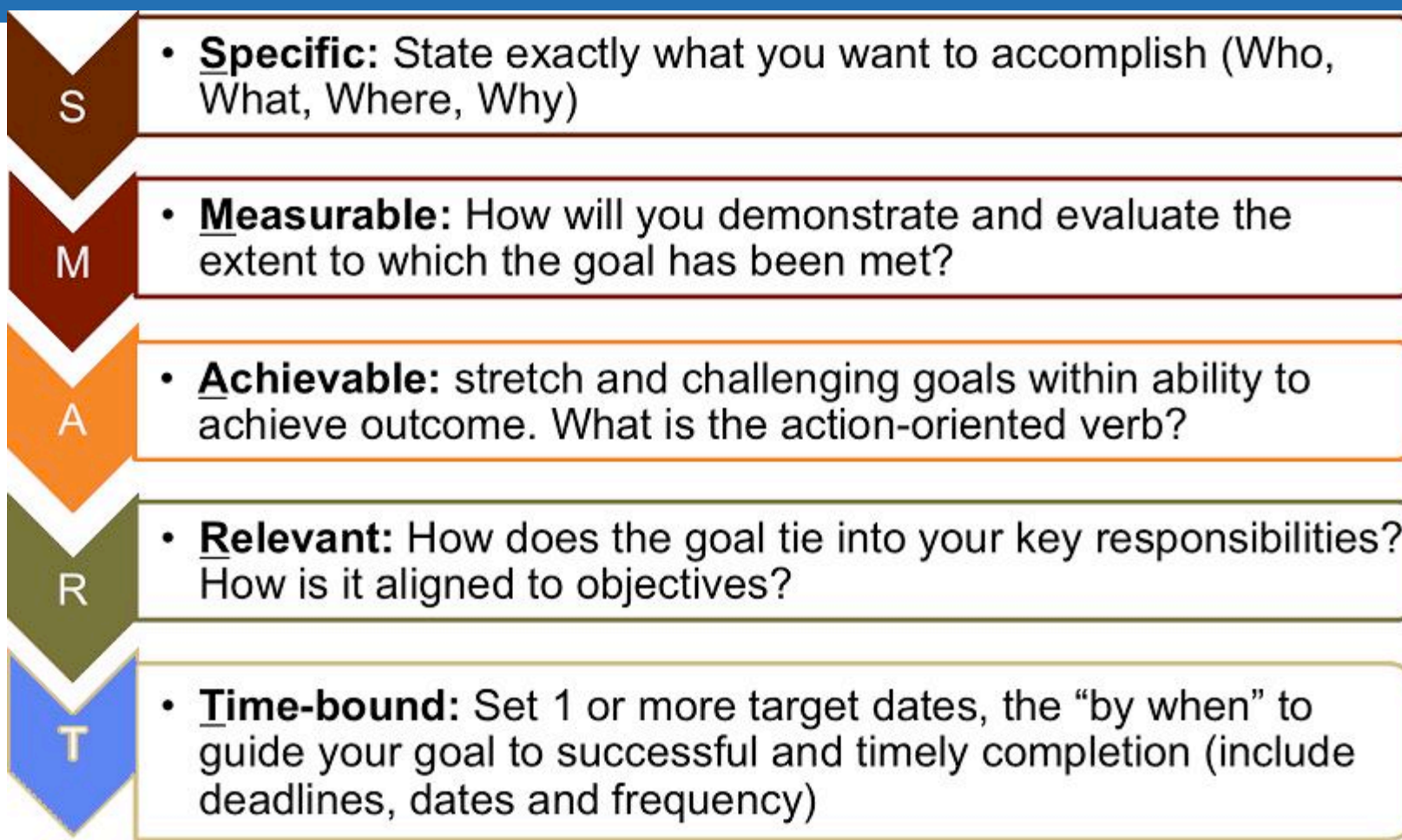
- Will the stakeholders be **happy** with the results?
- Do the objectives provide an **acceptable solution** to the problem?

R realistic

- Is the objective **achievable**, given the time and resources committed?
- Is the objective a **challenge or an excessive demand**?

T timely?

- **When** will the objectives be achieved?



Objectives

- Objectives should be consistent with the expected exploitation and impact of the project

Objectives ≠ activities!

- The right question:
 - What do I plan to achieve?
- The wrong question:
 - What am I going to do?
